Meadow Brook Theatre has grown into Michigan's largest producing professional theatre. For 57 years, MBT has distinguished itself as one of the finest producing regional theatres in the nation. Steeped in a long tradition of mounting top quality productions and building partnerships with the community, Meadow Brook Theatre continues to be a pillar of arts and culture for Oakland County and surrounding areas.

Due to state funding cuts, the Oakland University Board of Trustees was faced with a difficult decision to end its stewardship of MBT and in June of 2003 the theatre was forced to either close its doors, or become its own 501(c)3 nonprofit entity. Through the efforts of dedicated theatre staff, patrons, and donors, Meadow Brook Theatre has risen above that difficult time and continues to receive regional and national recognition for its work.

In its 52nd season, Meadow Brook Theatre had welcomed a Pre-Broadway World Premiere to its stage, as well as producing America's longest-running play. Both were met with critical acclaim and resulted in the 2017-2018 season setting ticket sale records for MBT.
